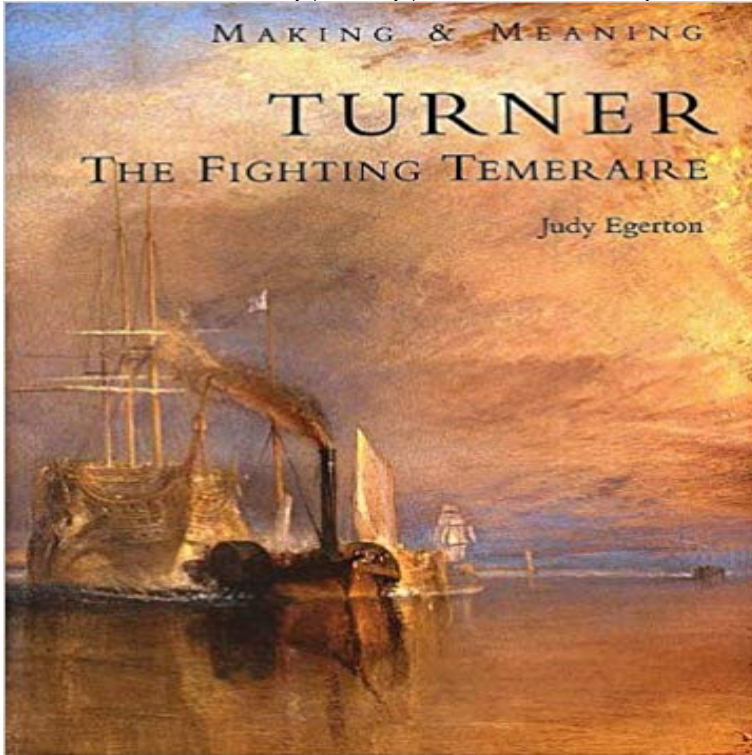


Turner: The Fighting Temeraire (Making & Meaning)
